A Tribute to Stirling McDowell

Dr. Stirling McDowell
December 14, 1931-February 4, 2002

Dr. Stirling McDowell's contribution to education and to teacher organizations has been enormous. Whether we recognize it or not, he has had a profound impact on the lives of the people of Saskatchewan, Canada and beyond. The lists of his accomplishments and of his awards are most impressive and are a matter of record; however, Stirling's professional contributions are not revealed in those lists.

Stirling has had a major impact on school governance in this province, particularly through his work on *The Education Act* of 1978; on teacher education through his successful efforts in the implementation of the four year degree program in education that included a full semester of internship; on the professional growth of teachers through his work on curriculum and instruction committees and his support for Project Overseas and Professional Exchange Seminars; and, on teacher welfare through his work at the negotiation table and in the

development of bi-level bargaining legislation in this province in 1973.

But perhaps Stirling's greatest legacy in his professional life is how he taught us the art of cooperation. It wasn't an accident that Stirling was chosen by the Canadian Teachers' Federation to take a lead in the negotiations that brought four world teacher organizations into one - a negotiation that began in 1986 at the meeting of the World Confederation of Organizations of the Teaching Profession in Regina and culminated in the founding of Education International, an organization of



several million teachers world wide, in Stockholm, Sweden in 1993. Nor was it an accident that he led the Saskatchewan provincial teacher bargaining team through its first nine turbulent years without one day of teacher instruction lost as a result of a dispute, or that he was successful in mediating numerous disputes including one between the Saskatchewan Medical Association and the Medical Care Insurance Commission.

His ability to clearly understand a problem and bring about a successful solution was a marvellous gift.

Executive Update

The regular Executive meeting was held on March 14 in Saskatoon. It was preceded by a series of committee meetings on March 13. Following are some of the highlights that may not be included in other reports:

- The proposed budget for 2002-2003 was approved for presentation to the AGM in May. It includes a proposed fee increase of \$3 (\$0.25 per month) to \$27. It also proposes an increase in the Chapter Rebate to \$7.00. Details are enclosed.
- The Executive Committee of ACER/CART presented the brief to the Commission on the Future of Health Care in Canada. ACER/CART will also be developing a policy on Health Care in Canada as seen by retired teachers.
- Resolutions passed at the 2001 AGM have been forwarded to the appropriate organizations and replies have been received from most of them. This information will be available to delegates at the AGM.
- The Benefits Committee reported that membership in the plans is

increasing slowly but steadily. Claims ratios are holding fairly steady. They will be reviewed carefully in July before negotiations start for a new contract. A number of items have been suggested to improve the contracts. They will be evaluated to determine cost implications during the negotiations. Further suggestions should be sent to the committee. Remember, we can include anything we want, as long as we are prepared to pay for it.

- Eye tests are covered once every two years. However, if you require them more frequently as a result of glaucoma or for other medical reasons, you should get a referral from your doctor. They are then covered as part of the Government Medical Plan.
- A letter will be sent to the Centennial Planning Committee requesting them to consider researching, documenting and displaying the names and locations of all Saskatchewan schools as one of the Centennial activities.

In addition to all of Stirling's documented achievements it would be a major oversight to leave out his passion for Saskatchewan history, Saskatchewan politics, Saskatchewan communities and Saskatchewan people.

He had an intimate knowledge of virtually every community in this province and an incredible ability to call people in every situation by their first name.

These lists of accomplishments also leave out the images of Stirling at the piano keyboard at social functions, or in his boat on a northern lake with his family or his insightful and articulate speeches at conventions and teacher meetings.

I was privileged to have met, on several occasions, the General Secretary of the All India Primary Teachers Federation. His name was Mishrah, and well into his 80's, he lived in the AIPTF Building in Delhi and used his retirement allowance as his salary. He was among the last of those living who had walked with Gandhi. His work with teachers was all consuming and his gentle manner pervasive. I knew that when I had met him I was in the presence of a great leader.

It was the same with Stirling. When I was with him I knew I was privileged to be in the presence of a great teacher, a great leader, a great friend and a great and gentle person.

Thank you, Stirling.

In closing, I wish to add a personal tribute to Dr. Stirling McDowell. I

first met Stirling in 1954. Since that time he has been a friend, a colleague, a leader, a mentor and an inspiration. We all know of his work for teachers and for all aspects of education. His dedication carried on into the area of retirement. He was the driving force behind the formation of CART and has shared his wonderful vision for us in STS. We will miss him.

Resolutions

for presentation to the 2002 Annual General Meeting

1. BE IT RESOLVED that the STS Benefits Committee attempt to negotiate to have CPAP and its related therapy for sleep apnea included in the STS Extended Health Plan.
Prince Albert Chapter
2. BE IT RESOLVED that the STS Benefits Committee negotiate to have compensation for patient attendant(s) (either at home or hospital) included in the Extended Health Care Plan.
Yorkton Chapter
3. BE IT RESOLVED that the STS urge its Medical Insurance carrier to be more flexible in its authorization for coverage of prescriptions that are not yet listed on the Saskatchewan Formulary of authorized medications.
Saskatoon Chapter.
4. BE IT RESOLVED that STS communicate to all its Chapters the importance of informing each health plan member of the varying prescription dispensing fee from one pharmacy to another, and of the importance of asking his/her physician if the prescription provided is on the Saskatchewan Formulary, and of the opportunity to have a non-formulary prescription accepted for insurance purposes upon a written explanation to the Insurance Carrier from the prescribing physician.
Saskatoon Chapter
5. BE IT RESOLVED that the STS urge the STF to negotiate a comprehensive health care plan for superannuated and retired teachers, one that is funded entirely by the provincial government, in their next round of provincial bargaining.
Melville Chapter
6. BE IT RESOLVED that the Provincial STS Executive approach the STF to have its Provincial Negotiating Committee attempt to negotiate an increase, to a maximum of \$50,000, payable to the policy holders of the Group Life Insurance Plan who are over age 65.
Regina Chapter
7. BE IT RESOLVED that the Superannuated Teachers of Saskatchewan request the Government of Canada to amend the Canada Pension Plan regulations, to allow calculations for the survivor's benefits to be based on the contributor/retirement income formula, and that this benefit be added to the survivor's own retirement benefits.
Yorkton Chapter
8. BE IT RESOLVED that the Provincial STS Executive make the appropriate changes so that the formula for calculating the number of delegates to the AGM results in a maximum of 200 delegates, starting with the 2003 AGM.
Regina Chapter
9. BE IT RESOLVED that, in conjunction with the 100th birthday of the province, the STS 2005 AGM be held in Regina, the capital city.
Regina Chapter
10. BE IT RESOLVED that the Provincial STS Executive devise a procedure that would allow all candidates participating in the elections at the AGM the opportunity to briefly address the delegates before voting takes place.
Regina Chapter
11. BE IT RESOLVED that the STS make a donation of \$2.00 per member as a memorial donation to the Dr. Stirling McDowell Foundation for Research into Teaching.
Unity Chapter
12. BE IT RESOLVED that AGM delegates from distant provinces be reimbursed for travelling expenses up to a maximum of \$500.00.

13. BE IT RESOLVED that STS immediately communicate to STF the urgency of assessing the direct impact that recent Government of Saskatchewan announced restructuring of school boards and school divisions will have on students currently attending Public and Separate School Systems.

Notices of Motion to Amend the STS Constitution and Bylaws 2002

Proposed changes to the Constitution and Bylaws are underlined.

NM#1 BE IT RESOLVED that the following amendments be made to the Constitution:

CONSTITUTION

Section II MEMBERSHIP

- C. Membership fees, as set by the STS Annual General Meeting, and when Authorized by the superannuate, shall be deducted by the Teachers Superannuation Commission or the Saskatchewan Teachers Retirement Plan. Where deduction at source is not authorized, the membership fees shall be forwarded to the Treasurer of STS by June 30. Late membership fees, paid to the Chapter Treasurer, shall be forwarded by the middle of the following month.

Section IV RELATIONSHIP WITH OTHER ORGANIZATIONS

- D. Be a member of Saskatchewan Seniors Mechanism (SSM).

Section VIII RESIGNATIONS

- D. If a vacancy occurs in the office of Councillor, the Executive shall make an appointment to the position from the members of the Executive.

STS Executive

NM#2 BE IT RESOLVED that the following amendments be made to the Bylaws:

BYLAWS

1. Section 2 EXECUTIVE AND STS MEETINGS

2.3 Representative voting at the STS Annual General Meeting shall be:

- a. The Executive shall, annually, determine the number of Chapter representatives to the AGM ensuring that no Chapter shall have fewer than two representatives.
- b. Executive members shall have voting privileges.
- c. The President shall arrange for a meeting of Non-Chapter members, at the time of the STS Annual General Meeting, but prior to the Annual Meeting, for the purpose of choosing representatives as prescribed under 2.3-a.

2. Section 4 **DUTIES OF APPOINTED MEMBERS**

4.1 Executive Secretary

- 4.1.1 Provide leadership, direction and overall supervision of STS activities.
- 4.1.2 Be responsible for the overall supervision of the STS office and the organization and allocation of duties of the office staff.
- 4.1.3 Be responsible for the overall supervision of the financial affairs of STS.
- 4.1.4 In cooperation with the STS President and the STS Executive foster good relationships and open communications with other organizations including governments. In particular time and effort should be directed towards achieving strong relationships with the STF, the STS Benefits Carrier, the TSC, the STRP, the TCU and the ACER/CART.
- 4.1.5 Facilitate the development and direct the implementation of STS Policies and Bylaws.
- 4.1.6 Take initiatives to increase STS membership.
- 4.1.7 Carry out other activities jointly agreed upon with the STS President and the STS Executive.

3. Section 5 **DUTIES OF COMMITTEES**

5.4 Annual General Meeting Planning Committee

- 5.4.1 Organize all matters pertaining to the STS Annual General Meeting.
Delete “and conduct”, and change the name of the committee.

5.5 Honorary Life Membership Committee

- 5.5.2 Recommend up to three candidates ...
Delete “select” and replace with “Recommend”.
- 5.5.3 Delete this section.**

5.10 Budget and Finance Committee

- 5.10.4 Oversee the investment of the Contingency Fund and recommend on the use of interest earnings and rebates.

4. Section 11 **LOCAL CHAPTERS**

- 11.2 The Chapter Secretary shall submit to the Secretary of STS and to the Chairperson of “Outreach”, by June 30, a list of the Chapter Executive with addresses, postal codes and telephone numbers.
- 11.3 The Chapter Secretary shall submit to the Secretary of STS, by June 30, the Names, addresses, postal codes, and telephone numbers of those Chapter members who have paid their regular membership fee to the Local Chapter. Late membership names shall be submitted by the middle of the month following payment of fees.
- 11.4 The Chapter Treasurer shall submit to the Treasurer of the STS, by June 30, per capita fee as specified by the STS Annual General Meeting for those Chapter members who have paid their regular membership fee to the Local Chapter. Late memberships shall be forwarded by the middle of the month following payment of fees.
- 11.8 The names of recipients of Chapter Awards shall be forwarded to the Honorary Life Chairperson by March 1. The recipients of Chapter Awards will be recognized at the Annual General Meeting.

5. Section 13 **SIGNING AUTHORITY**

- 13.1 Signing authority for the STS shall consist of any two of the following: President, Vice-President, Executive Secretary and one person appointed by the Executive.

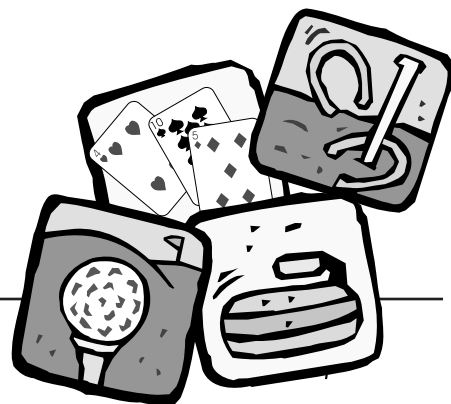

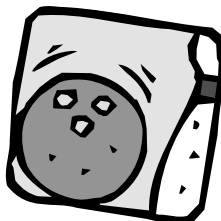
