Resolutions Directed to the STF

Resolution One

BE IT RESOLVED that the STS continue to examine ways of improving the indexing provisions of teachers' superannuation allowances.

Carried

Resolution Two

BE IT RESOLVED that STS request the STF to negotiate indexing of superannuation allowances in the TSP which is 100% of the Canadian CPI for the first \$25,000 of allowances, until such time as full indexing is achieved.

Resolutions Directed to the STS

Resolution Three

BE IT RESOLVED that the STS Group Benefits Health Plan cover the costs of cardiac rehabilitation when prescribed by a physician, to a yearly maximum which is the same as the yearly maximum for Paramedical Services under the STS Plan.

Resolution Four

BE IT RESOLVED that THAT the STS investigate the costs of increasing the yearly maximum to \$350 in the STS Group Benefits Health Plan for the following paramedical services: psychologist, speech therapist, podiatrist/chiropracist, acupuncturist, physiotherapist, chiropractor, naturopath, massage therapist.

BE IT RESOLVED that our Group Benefits Health Plan increase the maximum allowed benefit for prescription eyeglasses and contact lenses to \$200 every 2 calendar years.

BE IT RESOLVED that THAT our Group Benefits Health Plan increase the current maximum allowed benefit of \$1700 per person per calendar year for prescription drugs to reflect the effects of inflation.

BE IT RESOLVED that the STS Executive investigate amending the paramedical services clauses to provide for a maximum per member per calendar year, rather than per specialty per calendar year and, further, that the STS Executive report to the next annual meeting regarding this investigation.

BE IT RESOLVED that the STS consider implementing a name change from Superannuated to Retired to more closely reflect the makeup of all its membership.

Councillors' Report

On October 14-16, 2010 our eight STS Councillors, Calvin Bachmeier, Shirley Dyck, Doug Haroldson, Mike Kaminski, Margaret Martin, Jim Segó, Maxine Stinka, and Robert Wuschenny, attended the STF Councillors' Conference and Special Meeting of Council in Saskatoon. Councillors received STF organizational updates regarding governance, administration, provincial collective bargaining, and Federation advocacy initiatives.

Because the STF Bargaining Team has been in negotiation with the Government-Trustee Team since January, 2010, two Special Meetings of Council were called on November 27, 2010, and April 2, 2011, to update STF Councillors on the negotiation process. Our STS Councillors were also invited to attend, and several were in attendance at these two meetings.

On April 13-16, 2011, our eight Councillors, with Gerald Mamer substituting for Jim Segó, attended the STS Annual Meeting of Council in Saskatoon.

On Thursday, April 14, the educational partners addressed the more than 200 Councillors. The Minister of Education, Donna Harpauer, Saskatchewan School Boards Association President Sandi Urban-Hall, LEADS President Rob Currie, and CTF Vice President Dianne Woloschuk all brought greetings. We also heard the addresses presented by STF President Steven Allen and STF General Secretary Gwen Dueck.

On Friday, April 15 all Councillors spent time reviewing the 42 resolutions and eight notices of motion in four small groups: Governance, Administration, Economic Services, and Social and Political Advocacy/Professional Stewardship

and Responsibility. As well, we took part in re-electing STF President Steven Allen and STF Vice-President Sonja Susut for the 2011-2012 year. A reception and dinner followed on Friday evening where Arbos Awards for contributions to the professional organization were presented to Carol Moen and Ken Moore and an Arbos Award for contributions to education and the teaching profession was presented to Phyllis Fowler, a Saskatoon educator.

On Saturday, April 16 Councillors voted on the 42 resolutions and eight notices of motion. Among these

resolutions were six STS resolutions that were submitted to the STF. Of these resolutions three were passed, one was referred to the STF Executive, and two were defeated. Please note all of the resolutions and notices of motion and the voting results in the May 11, 2011, issue of the Saskatchewan *Bulletin*.

Because Shirley Dyck will not be a STS Councillor for 2011-2012, I would like to thank her for her many years of service as STS Councillor and for the many years prior as an STF Councillor.
