President's Report

The STS Annual General Meeting was held at the Travelodge Hotel in Saskatoon May 10-12, 2016. Our AGM is a major event of the STS because it serves as the major governance component. The STS is a policy-driven organization; therefore, the formation, debate and voting on resolutions is very important. In addition to dealing with resolutions, Delegates had an opportunity to attend lively and informative interest sessions. They participated in the business meeting where they heard Committee Reports, voted on the 2016-17 budget, and elected the Provincial Executive. Delegates were also entertained on Tuesday and Wednesday evenings. Thanks to the AGM Planning Committee and the Co-chairs Joyce Hoffman and Jane Isinger for a well planned AGM.

STS membership has now reached 10,935. We anticipate the membership will surpass 11,000 by the end of 2016. Similarly membership in the STS Group Benefit Plan continues to increase. The Plan has performed well during the first year of a three-year contract. There are several improvements in the plan effective July 1, 2016.

The financial position of the STS remains strong due to the ongoing oversight by the Budget, Finance and Audit Committee, the Executive, and committed Office Staff. We are hoping to complete the 2015-16 year with a

balanced budget. The AGM accepted the proposed Budget for 2016-17 with an annual membership fee of \$30. Chapter rebates will be \$400 plus \$8 per member. The change in the rebate is based on the fact that Guideline #10 "Chapter Activity Support Program" has been deleted.

The McDowell Foundation is celebrating its 25th Anniversary. In recognition of this event Ellen Whiteman, Manager of the Foundation, made a presentation on Thursday morning of the AGM. In her presentation she highlighted the history of the Foundation, the need for continued support, and recognition of the support by Judy Buzowetsky and George Georget. The AGM also approved a one time donation by the STS of \$2500.

The granting of Honorary Life Membership in the STS provides major recognition of those who serve our organization at the Chapter and Provincial levels, as well as their communities. Congratulations to our 2016 Honorary Life recipients: Velma Gerrard, Okanagan Valley Chapter; Bill Meger, Saskatoon Chapter; and Mel Osolinsky, Wakaw Chapter.

I wish to thank our Chapters and their Executives who provide many supports to members in the form of information, program, and social functions. Forty-one Chapters provided 204 delegates to the AGM,

the "parliament" of our organization. Provincial recreational events would not occur without the hosting Chapters.

Special thanks to Kate McCorrison for her many years of service on the Executive. She will be missed. We wish her the very best in the future. Welcome to Laurie Dubé, Mainline Chapter; Marie LeBlanc-Warick, Saskatoon Chapter; Doreen Rathgeber, Yorkton Chapter; and Sue Amundrud, Carrot River Valley (Melfort & District) Chapter. The 43rd Annual General Meeting of Superannuated Teachers of Saskatchewan was held on May 10, 11 and 12, 2016 at the Travelodge Hotel in Saskatoon. STS Resolutions 2016

Resolutions Directed to the STS (A) (Bylaws)

A 1. BE IT RESOLVED that Bylaw 3 (1.5) be deleted and replaced with the following: "In the election of members of the Executive, only one ballot shall be held and those candidates receiving the highest number of votes will be declared elected."

Defeated

A 2. BE IT RESOLVED that STS Bylaws be amended by the addition of the following: STS Group Benefits Unappropriated Reserve

1. An Unappropriated Reserve Fund shall be maintained at a level to be determined by the STS Executive as outlined in the STS Guidelines.
2. Monies intended for the fund shall be kept in a separate fund.
3. The Unappropriated Reserve Fund shall be used to support the Appropriated Reserve or used for group benefits as determined by the Executive.
4. The Executive shall regularly review the adequacy of the fund in relation to possible uses of monies from the fund.

Carried as amended

A 3. BE IT RESOLVED that Bylaw 3, Section 2 (2.2) be deleted and replaced with the following: "Should a President be elected for more than one term, the Past-President shall be offered the position of Past-President for a one year term."

Defeated

A 4. BE IT RESOLVED that Bylaw 1, Section 1, be amended by the addition of the following: "(1.7) "A counting committee composed of Members as defined in Bylaw 1, shall be established by motion of the AGM."

Defeated

A 5. BE IT RESOLVED that the STS annual fee for 2016-2017 be \$30.00 per person.

Carried

A 6. BE IT RESOLVED that the STS annual rebate to each Chapter for 2016-2017 be \$400.00 plus \$8.00 per member.

Carried

(Non-Bylaws)

A 7. BE IT RESOLVED that the STS request SSM to lobby the Government of Saskatchewan to restore the income threshold level for the Seniors' Drug Plan to the same level used by the Government of Canada for the claw back for OAS.

Carried

A 8. BE IT RESOLVED that the STS investigate the cost of providing coverage to a lifetime maximum of \$1500.00 per person for the purchase of a motorized scooter when prescribed by a physician.

Carried as amended

A 9. BE IT RESOLVED that the following Policy 13 be added to the *Superannuated Teachers of Saskatchewan Policy Handbook*: "The Superannuated Teachers of Saskatchewan believes that the income threshold for all Saskatchewan seniors to qualify for the Saskatchewan Seniors' Drug Plan be the same as the threshold for the claw back for OAS."

Carried

A 10. BE IT RESOLVED that the following Policy 14 be added to the *Superannuated Teachers of Saskatchewan Policy Handbook*: "The Superannuated Teachers of Saskatchewan believes that all

Saskatchewan seniors should have free access to physician ordered rehabilitation services."

Carried

A 11. BE IT RESOLVED that the STS and Saskatchewan Blue Cross consolidate the Extended Health and Dental Plan information into a handbook that provides:

- a) Space to allow any changes in the Plan to be handwritten by the participant to keep information up to date;
- b) How to pursue an appeal; and,
- c) A question and answer section dealing with pertinent topics such as pre-existing conditions, travel, and how to get a print copy of the handbook.

Carried

A 12. BE IT RESOLVED that the STS place the regularly updated Extended Health and Dental Plan Handbook on the STS website and provide a print copy to participants who request one.

Carried

A 13. BE IT RESOLVED that effective July 1, 2016, "Guideline 10 – Chapter Activity Support Program" be deleted from the STS *Policy Handbook* and the program terminated.

Carried

A 14. BE IT RESOLVED that the STS add a line on the Application to join the STS asking if the personal email address of the new STS member could be shared with the Chapter that the new superannuate is joining and with disclosure on the application form that such information will not be shared with any entities outside the local Chapter and the Provincial STS to which the member shall belong.

Carried as amended

A 15. BE IT RESOLVED that the STS Executive look at the feasibility of increasing the amounts of the STS Scholarships for subsequent years.

Carried

A 16. BE IT RESOLVED that the STS issue printed, official membership cards, with the member's name, to all STS members.

Defeated

A 17. BE IT RESOLVED that the following Policy be added to *Superannuated Teachers of Saskatchewan Policy Handbook*: "As a local of the STF, adopt election bylaws, policies and procedures modeled on current STF bylaws, policies and procedures."

Defeated

A 18. BE IT RESOLVED that Guidelines 1 – Duties of Executive Committees, Section 1.6, be amended by the addition of the following: "(1.6.11) The Nominations Committee shall present a motion to the AGM naming the Members as defined in Bylaw 1, who will form the Counting Committee".

Defeated

A 19. BE IT RESOLVED that Guideline 9 – Financial Affairs, be amended by the addition of the following: "Section 9.3, Group Benefits Unappropriated Reserve Fund.

9.3.1 The goal is to maintain an Unappropriated Reserve Fund at a level of at least twice the amount of the current year's Appropriated Reserve Fund.

9.3.2 Should the reserve exceed twice the Appropriated Reserve Fund the Executive shall report to members on the use of the surplus to improve benefits and/or lower fees.

9.3.3 The Executive shall report annually to the AGM on all uses of the fund as determined by the Executive."

Referred to the STS Executive

A 20. BE IT RESOLVED that the STS make a one-time donation of \$2500 to the McDowell Foundation in recognition of the Foundation's twenty-fifth Anniversary.

Carried as amended

Resolutions Directed to the STF (B)

B 1. BE IT RESOLVED that the STS request the STF to negotiate with the Government of Saskatchewan to provide no cost registration for members of the STS by the Saskatchewan Professional Teachers Regulatory Board.

Carried as amended

B 2. BE IT RESOLVED that the STS urge the STF to negotiate with the Teachers' Group Life Insurance carrier to increase the insurance coverage from 85 years to 90 years for those enrolled in the Group Life Insurance Plan.

Carried

Resolutions Directed to ACER-CART (C)

C 1. BE IT RESOLVED that the STS request ACER-CART to lobby the Government of Canada to consult with the Provincial and Territorial Governments in order to implement a National Drug Plan, operating under the Canada Health Act, to cover the cost of Approved Prescription Drugs for all Canadians.

Carried

Resolutions Directed to the Government of Saskatchewan (D)

D 1. BE IT RESOLVED that the Superannuated Teachers of Saskatchewan lobby the Government of Saskatchewan to amend the legislation that regulates pharmacies and the dispensing fees to effect required changes which would protect the consumers, provide a consistent approach to the dispensing of medications, and enable dispensing a prescription of more than one month for one fee.

Carried

D 2. BE IT RESOLVED that the STS request SSM to urge the Government of Saskatchewan to provide physician ordered cardiac rehabilitation at no cost for seniors.

Carried as amended

Late Resolutions

A 21. BE IT RESOLVED that the STS increase the grant to a Chapter hosting provincial curling to \$1000.

Tabled

A 22. BE IT RESOLVED that the STS donate \$10,000.00 from the Contingency Fund to the Canadian Red Cross Fort McMurray Fire Relief.

Defeated

A 23. BE IT RESOLVED that Guideline 2.4 be amended to allow for a grant of \$1000 for curling, golf, bowling and Stitch 'N Quilt. The grant will be paid in two installments (\$750 on application and \$250 upon receiving the handbook and the final report for the event).

Carried

NOTE: The grant provisions for all other recreation activities shall remain in accordance with Guideline 2.4.

Budget, Finance and Audit

The 2016 Annual General Meeting passed the 2016-17 budget as published in the last *Outreach*. The annual membership fee for 2016-17 will remain at \$30. The Delegates also passed a resolution to terminate the Chapter Activity Support Program as it did not seem to be meeting the needs of our members. Instead, the annual rebate to Chapters will be \$400 per Chapter plus \$8 per member.
