Councillors' Report

Maxine Stinka

The Councillors who represented the STS at STF meetings were Sunil Pandila, Don Gabel, Doug Still, Alan Laughlin, Jane Isinger, Joyce Hoffman, Sue Amundrud, and Maxine Stinka. Anna Wehrkamp served as an alternate. Both the STF Councillor Conference and Special Meeting of Council, and the Annual Meeting of Council were attended by STS representatives.

The STF Annual Meeting of Council was held May 1-4, 2019, in Saskatoon. Very few of the resolutions pertained directly to STS members. There was one regarding payment of STF fees for those who teach half-time or less.

The group was informed that the STF fee structure is being reviewed and as a result, this resolution was referred to the Executive. Councillors also discussed "Objectives for Teachers' Consideration" for the upcoming Provincial Collective Bargaining sessions.

President Patrick Maze was elected to a two-year term. Brent Keen did not run for Vice-President and Samantha Becotte was elected by acclamation. Elected to the Executive for a two-year term were Nathan Bromm, Karen Kennedy-Allin, Ben Goby, and Nadine Jennison. Neal Boutin, Michael Hagel,

Vincent Mamer, and Debbie Ward will complete their two-year term June 30, 2020.

There was no discussion around the change to Portaplan that eliminates the non-payment of premiums after age 90. Only those over 85 were grandfathered and all others were informed by letter that if they wanted this benefit, they would have to pay considerably higher premiums. The STS wrote a letter to the STF about their concern with this change and received a letter indicating "these changes were based on the principles of equity, transparency, and consistency".

Group Benefits

The Group Benefits Committee members for 2018-19 are Sunil Pandila (ex-officio), Don Gabel, Helen Sukovieff, Joyce Hoffman, Sue Amundrud, Jane Isinger, Mike Kaminski, Marie LeBlanc-Warick, Diane Marchand, Lyle Markowski, Doreen Rathgeber, Doug Still, Anna Wehrkamp, Adeline Wuschenny, Fred Herron, and Maxine Stinka (Chair). Thanks to them for their service on this very important Committee.

The present Group Benefits contract with Saskatchewan Blue Cross runs from July 1, 2018, to June 30, 2021. Plan participants experienced an increase in premiums on July 1, 2018. The Extended Health Plan will have


another increase in premiums July 1, 2019, but the Dental premiums will be unchanged for the length of the three-year agreement. A new *STS Members Benefit Pamphlet* is available from the STS office upon request.

As of March 1, 2019, there was a surplus of about \$480,000 in Extended Health and about \$660,000 in Dental for a total surplus of just over \$1.1 million. Surpluses are expected in the first year of a new contract. Drugs remain the highest single cost for the plan at about \$2.5 million annually. As of March 1, 2019, total membership in one or both plans was 7910.

At Committee meetings, there is an opportunity to ask questions

of Saskatchewan Blue Cross representatives regarding clarification and issues that may arise. We appreciate the relationship that has developed over the years between Saskatchewan Blue Cross and STS. Thank you to Bob Wilhelms and Leslie Donsberger (Saskatchewan Blue Cross) for their continued support over the years.

Also, thank you to our Office Staff (Colleen, Heather, and MJ) and Executive Secretary Fred for all their hard work and professionalism in keeping our Group Benefits Plan running smoothly. Finally, thank you to the Plan members for their ownership and prudent use of our Extended Health and Dental Plan.

Resolutions Directed to STS (A)

Information regarding the disposition of resolutions pertaining to Bylaws will be sent to each Chapter President for distribution to members.

A.3 Be It Resolved that Guideline 2 – Chapters and Committees Hosting Recreational Events 2.4 read as follows:

Finances

The Local STS Chapter is the body responsible for financing the recreational activity. The Provincial Organization awards a grant for each of the annual events authorized by the STS Executive. An amount of \$1500.00 is awarded for Curling, Golf, Bowling and Stitch 'N Quilt and will be paid in two installments (\$1000.00 on application and \$500.00 upon receiving the final report for the event). An amount of \$750.00 is awarded for Fishing, Horseshoes, Kaiser, Bridge and other activities approved by the STS Executive and will be paid in two installments (\$500.00 on application and \$250.00 upon receiving the final report for the event). These grants are available upon application to the Executive Secretary at the STS Office

Carried

A.4 Be It Resolved that the STS investigate the inclusion of coverage for C-PAP units in the STS Group Benefits Plan.

Carried

A.5 Be It Resolved that the STS investigate the inclusion of coverage for the shingles vaccine in the STS Group Benefits Plan.

Carried

A.6 Be It Resolved that the STS investigate extending travel coverage from 65 days per trip to 93 days per trip in the STS Group Benefits Plan.

Defeated

A.7 Be It Resolved that the STS encourage Saskatchewan Blue Cross to consider that a medication substitution initiated by a pharmacy because of

inadequate supply not be considered as a new prescription for travel purposes.

Resolutions Directed to STF (B)

B.1 Be It Resolved that the STS strongly encourage the STF to have all revisions regarding fundamental changes to Portaplan come to the STF Annual Meeting of Council prior to their implementation.

Carried

B.2 Be It Resolved that the STS urge the STF to negotiate changes to the Teachers' Group Life Insurance Plan to increase coverage from 85 to 90 years of age.

Defeated

Resolutions Directed to ACER-CART (C)

C.1 Be It Resolved that STS work with SSM and ACER-CART to encourage governments to provide income tax credits for seniors who need to access help to be able to remain in their own homes.

Carried

C.2 Be It Resolved that the STS together with ACER-CART request the federal government to increase the Pension Income Amount (line 314 on CRA income tax forms) deduction from \$2,000 to \$5,000.

Carried

C.3 Be It Resolved that the STS together with SSM and ACER-CART lobby the federal government to withdraw Bill C-27 which would allow defined-benefit pension plans under federal jurisdiction to be converted to target-benefit plans.

Carried

Resolutions Directed to the Government (D)

D.1 Be It Resolved that STS, subject to STF Bylaw 4.5.1 and STS Bylaw 6.2.7.5, work with SSM to lobby the Government of Saskatchewan to establish a Seniors Advocate position for the Province of Saskatchewan.

Carried

D.2 Be It Resolved that the STS, subject to STF Bylaw 4.5.1 and STS Bylaw 6.2.7.5, lobby the government of Saskatchewan to invest in attracting, recruiting, training, and retaining of teachers for the North/Northern areas.

Carried

D.3 Be It Resolved that the STS, subject to STF Bylaw 4.5.1 and STS Bylaw 6.2.7.5, lobby the provincial government to fully fund the cost of C-PAP units.

Carried

D.4 Be It Resolved that the STS, subject to STF Bylaw 4.5.1 and STS Bylaw 6.2.7.5, lobby the provincial government to add the shingles vaccine to the Saskatchewan Drug Plan Formulary.

Carried

D.5 Be It Resolved that the STS, subject to STF Bylaw 4.5.1 and STS Bylaw 6.2.7.5, urge the Provincial government to establish a law that seatbelts, as well as on-board event data recorders similar to those in airplanes to expedite investigations and accurate data collection, be made mandatory on all buses.

Referred to STS Executive

D.6 Be It Resolved that the STS, subject to STF Bylaw 4.5.1 and STS Bylaw 6.2.7.5, urge the Government of Saskatchewan to add the insulin Toujeo Solostar to the provincial drug formulary.

Carried

D.7 Be It Resolved that the STS, subject to STF Bylaw 4.5.1 and STS Bylaw 6.2.7.5, work with SSM to encourage the province of Saskatchewan to hire more geriatricians for the province.

Carried

D.8 Be It Resolved that STS, subject to STF Bylaw 4.5.1 and STS Bylaw 6.2.7.5, work with SSM to encourage the province of Saskatchewan to work with the Saskatchewan College of Massage Therapy to move legislation forward to regulate massage therapists in this province.
