The STS Provincial Executive met on March 8 and 9, 2011, in Saskatoon. Our membership is now at 9,418 with many new superannuates soon to be joining our organization. Our Budget, Finance and Audit Committee along with the Executive accepted the 2011-2012 Proposed Budget that you will find included in this issue. Please review it and take any questions to your Chapter delegates who will be attending the 38th Annual General Meeting of the Superannuated Teachers of Saskatchewan on May 10 to 13, 2011, at the Travelodge Hotel in Saskatoon. They will be considering this budget for approval at that time. Our Group Benefits Committee reviewed the financial reports for the second year (February 1, 2010, to January 31, 2011) of our three-year contract with our carrier, Saskatchewan Blue Cross. We have noted that our Dental Plan has experienced a deficit for eight of the past twelve months. The Extended Health Plan continues to operate efficiently. We will continue to monitor the financial reports for our Extended Health and Dental Plan

to ensure that it remains viable. *Outreach* is now received by email by 630 STS members. If you wish to receive email notification that *Outreach* has been posted on the STS website, please send an email message to the STS Office. The Resolutions Committee received the sixteen resolutions that are also reprinted in this issue. They will be discussed and voted upon at our STS AGM.

STS Resolutions 2011

The following resolutions were received as of March 9, 2011:

Resolutions Directed to the STF

Resolution One

BE IT RESOLVED that the STS continue to examine ways of improving the indexing provisions of teachers' superannuation allowances.
– Saskatoon Chapter

Background: This resolution reaffirms the STS position in the resolution passed at the 2010 AGM.

Resolution Two

BE IT RESOLVED that the STS request the STF to negotiate indexing of superannuation allowances in the TSP which is 100% of the Canadian CPI for the first \$25,000 of allowances, until such time as full indexing is achieved.

Background: This would reflect our attempt to address those superannuates living below the poverty line that are living so long that unfortunately the compounding effect of indexing has drastically shrunken their pension. That portion of all allowances over \$25,000 would still be indexed at 80%. Although the STS maintains the goal of full indexing, this resolution sets out a partial return to full indexing until such time as full indexing is achieved.

Resolutions Directed to the STS

Resolution Three

BE IT RESOLVED that the STS Group Benefits Health Plan cover the costs of cardiac rehabilitation when prescribed by a physician, to a yearly maximum which is the same

as the yearly maximum for Paramedical Services under the STS Plan.
– Saskatoon Chapter

Background: Current life-time maximum payment is \$600. Rehabilitation costs for the Saskatoon and Regina programs are approximately \$50/month. Other medical treatments such as massage, chiropractic, acupuncture are currently subjected to the \$250 yearly maximum with no life-time maximum. Cardiac rehabilitation would therefore be treated as equivalent to these procedures in our health plan.

Resolution Four

BE IT RESOLVED that the STS investigate the costs of increasing the yearly maximum to \$350 in the STS Group Benefits Health Plan for the following paramedical services: psychologist, speech therapist, podiatrist/chiropractor, acupuncturist, physiotherapist, chiropractor, naturopath, massage therapist.
– Saskatoon Chapter

Background: Current maximum yearly payment is \$250 per specialty. The current maximum yearly payment in the STF Plan is \$500.

Resolution Five

BE IT RESOLVED that our Group Benefits Health Plan increase the maximum allowed benefit for prescription eyeglasses and contact lenses to \$200 every two calendar years.
– Moosomin Chapter

Background: Current benefits allow for \$100 every two years for prescription eyeglasses/contact lenses, and have been at this level since 2006. Current costs for eyeglasses can easily exceed \$500 for lenses alone. Benefits for paramedical services (chiropractor,

registered massage therapists, etc.) are currently at \$250 per year (up from \$225 per year) as of the last three year agreement with Blue Cross.

Resolution Six

BE IT RESOLVED that our Group Benefits Health Plan increase the current maximum allowed benefit of \$1,700 per person per calendar year for prescription drugs to reflect the effects of inflation.

– Moosomin Chapter

Background: The current benefit of \$1,700 per person has been in effect since the year 2000. During this time there has been no adjustment to reflect the increase in prescription drug costs that has occurred over the last decade.

Resolution Seven

BE IT RESOLVED that the STS Executive investigate amending the paramedical services' clauses to provide for a maximum per member per calendar year, rather than per specialty per calendar year and, further, that the STS Executive report to the next annual meeting regarding this investigation.

– Nipawin Chapter

Resolution Eight

BE IT RESOLVED that the STS consider implementing a name change from *Superannuated* to *Retired* to more closely reflect the makeup of all its membership.

– Langenburg Chapter

Background: Teachers who retired under the superannuation plan are both retired and superannuated. Teachers who retire under the STRP are retired, but not superannuated. The word *retired* applies to both; *superannuated* does not. It is important that the name of our organization be inclusive and all-encompassing.

Of all the organizations belonging to ACER-CART, we are the only group which still refers to itself as *superannuated*. ACER-CART = Canadian Association of Retired Teachers.

Resolution Nine

BE IT RESOLVED that Policy 10 – Dr. Stirling McDowell Foundation Grant be amended to read as follows:

10.1. The STS will award an annual grant of \$2,000.00 in support of the activities of the Dr. Stirling McDowell Foundation.

Resolution Ten

BE IT RESOLVED that Policy 10 – Dr. Stirling McDowell Foundation Grant be amended by adding the following:

10.2. The STS will make memorial donations to the Dr. Stirling McDowell Foundation in accordance with the following schedule:

- Death of an active STS Executive Member \$1,000.00
- Death of the spouse of an active STS Executive Member \$500.00
- Death of a former STS President or an Honorary Life Member \$500.00

Resolution Eleven

BE IT RESOLVED that the Superannuated Teachers of Saskatchewan (including all Chapters and members) take appropriate action (including financial donations) to commemorate the twentieth anniversary of the McDowell Foundation.

Resolution Twelve

BE IT RESOLVED that candidates for STS Executive positions be provided an opportunity to speak briefly to the General Assembly at the beginning of the AGM.

– Prince Albert Chapter

Resolution Thirteen

BE IT RESOLVED that Honorary Life Members who attend the AGM receive the same rights and privileges as delegates.

– Prince Albert Chapter

Resolution Fourteen

BE IT RESOLVED That the Superannuated Teachers of Saskatchewan

(including all Chapters and members) continue their efforts to encourage the federal government to persuade the Canadian International Development Agency (CIDA) to restore funding to the Canadian Teachers' Federation (CTF) for International Development Education Projects.

Resolutions Directed to ACER-CART

Resolution Fifteen

BE IT RESOLVED that the STS request ACER-CART to actively lobby the Government of Canada to make Canadian adult passports effective for ten years.

– George Rothenburger

Background:

1. At present Canadian passports are effective for five years.
2. The Canadian Government had announced in 2009 that a ten-year passport would be implemented in 2010-2011. Instead a renewable system for the five-year passport was put into affect.
3. The United States of America and the United Kingdom have passports that are effective for ten years.

Resolution Sixteen

BE IT RESOLVED that the STS request ACER-CART and SSM to Lobby the Federal and Provincial governments to allow tax deductions for fees associated with seniors' physical activity-based programs.

CIDA Eliminated Funding for International Development Education Projects

The Superannuated Teachers of Saskatchewan (STS) continues to express concern about the removal of funding for the Canadian International Development Agency (CIDA) to the Canadian Teachers' Federation (CTF) for international development education projects.

For over fifty years, Canadian teachers have had a tremendous impact on improving teaching and learning in developing countries that have requested assistance. Through programs such a Project Overseas and Project India (a Saskatchewan initiative) the respect for Canada, our teachers and our educational system has been raised to among the highest in the world. In addition, teachers, students, communities and school systems in Canada have benefited immensely from these programs. Teachers have been able to open the world to Canadian students as a consequence of Canadian teacher involvement.

The STS Executive is encouraging STS Chapters and individual Chapter members to contact their Member(s) of Parliament and request reconsideration of this very damaging decision affecting international development education programs.

McDowell Foundation Report

During this 20th Anniversary of the establishment of the Dr. Stirling McDowell Foundation for Research into Teaching, the Foundation Board continues to incorporate some of the suggestions of the Board Dynamics Governance study. Recently, the Board had a conference call to react to proposed changes to the Articles of Incorporation, Bylaws, and Administrative Policies that would be required to move forward in the reorganization of the Foundation. The changes approved by the Board must then be approved by the STF Executive in order to revise these three documents. If approved by the STF Executive, there will be some changes to the Board structure but there will be continued STS representation on it.

The STS Executive has submitted the following two resolutions to the STF Spring Council, April 13-16, 2011.

- **BE IT RESOLVED** that the Saskatchewan Teachers' Federation, in honour of the 20th Anniversary of the Dr. Stirling McDowell Foundation for Research into Teaching, initiate a Plan to lead the Education Partners in celebrating the value of the Foundation and teacher-led research to the publicly funded education system in Saskatchewan and elsewhere.
- **BE IT RESOLVED** that the Saskatchewan Teachers' Federation initiate a plan for commemorating the 20th Anniversary of the founding of the Dr. Stirling McDowell Foundation for Research into Teaching that will engage teachers in learning about teacher contributions to educational knowledge, including the work of Dr. Stirling McDowell.

The STS Executive is also submitting three resolutions to the STS Annual General Meeting regarding

financial support of the McDowell Foundation.

The STS Executive decided on the following plans to celebrate the 20th anniversary of the McDowell Foundation:

1. Submit two resolutions to STF spring council.
2. Submit three resolutions to the STS AGM.
3. Send a letter to the McDowell Foundation encouraging them to recognize the anniversary.
4. Invite Michelle Prytula (a recipient of the Foundation's annual

award) to make a presentation at our AGM.

5. Prepare an article about Dr. Stirling McDowell in *Outreach* as a "Spotlight on Superannuates"

The McDowell Foundation has provided valuable support for teacher-led action research in the classrooms of Saskatchewan and will continue to do so with the financial support of both teachers and retired teachers. Chapter donations, as well as those of individual retired teachers, are greatly appreciated.

Group Benefits

Shirley Henderson

The second year of our contract with Saskatchewan Blue Cross has just been completed. The Committee reviewed the claims experience report and found the following:

- The extended health program has experienced a small surplus. With the introduction of the drug claims card, the costs to the plan have increased some but they are levelling off.
- The dental program is a different case, and has had a deficit in 2010-2011. The Committee will closely monitor the plan experience. These extra costs may be due to increased usage as the membership numbers have grown and also the increases in the Dental Fee Guide.

The policy for ambulance coverage is as follows: reimbursement will be

made if the ambulance takes the member to the hospital. If the ambulance is called, the member is checked out and then decides not to go to the hospital, this will be considered as an "incomplete trip" and Saskatchewan Blue Cross will not reimburse the cost.

If you know of any active teachers who are considering retiring soon remind them about the 60 day window for open enrolment into our Group Benefits Plan. They and their dependents will be accepted into the Plan without any question of pre-existing conditions.

One thing as members we need to keep in mind is that this is our Plan and we are responsible for it. Yes, we can have additional coverage but are we willing to have increased premiums?
